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## Executive Summary

This report provides statistical information on sexual assaults reported to law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin. This information is collected as part of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program.

The assaults described and analyzed in this report are those that were reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies between January 1 and December 31, 2010. The data are submitted to OJA as part of the monthly UCR reports. As with any sensitive crime, actual number of offenses reported are not totally representative of all assaults committed. Assaults not reported to law enforcement agencies cannot be addressed in this report, even though they April be reported to other agencies such as social services, medical agencies, victim services, clergy and others. Therefore, this report should be considered one measurement of the number of sexual assaults occurring in Wisconsin.

This report will focus on six sexual assault offense types defined by the Wisconsin UCR program. These offense types are: *Forcible Rape*, *Forcible Sodomy*, *Assault with an Object*, *Forcible Fondling*, *Statutory Rape*, and *Ejaculate/Excrete upon Victim*.

This report is organized into four separate sections related to different elements of sexual assaults: offenses, victim, relationships, and offenders. These sections are broken down into sub-sections which are accompanied by tables and charts highlighting the statistical analysis of these findings. In addition, detailed data tables are provided in the Appendices for further statistical information. Below are the major findings from the 2010 report on sexual assaults in Wisconsin.

- There were 4,857 sexual assaults reported to law enforcement agencies in 2010, a 5% increase from 2009.
- Forcible Fondling was the most reported sexual assault in 2010, accounting for 45% of total sexual assaults.
- The overall clearance rate for sexual assaults reported in 2010 was 53%.
- The Victim Residence and the Offender Residence categories accounted for nearly two-thirds of the location sites in reported sexual assaults.
- Sexual assaults were most often reported as having occurred on Fridays and Mondays, and were reported at a consistent rate throughout the year.
- Juveniles are nearly three times more likely than adults to be victims of sexual assault.
- Fifty-two percent of sexual assaults were committed by people known to the victim but outside the victim's family.
- The 16-20 year old age group represents the highest offending population, while 11-15 years olds were the highest victimized age group.
- The rate of domestic sexual assaults had stabilized over the past two years.

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# Overview

## Report

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*Sexual Assaults in Wisconsin*, prepared by the OJA's Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), is a collection of sexual assault data reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2010. It contains detailed information on sexual assault volume, trends, victims, relationships, and offenders.

Since the 1930's law enforcement agencies have been reporting on rape and attempted rape of females as part of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. The FBI limited its definition of rape to include "penis to vagina" penetration or attempted penetration of females. Therefore, any sex crimes that did not include vaginal penetration were excluded from the UCR program. In Wisconsin, however, the SAC began collecting data on all sexual assaults, including those previously excluded by the FBI, in January 1984 through its UCR program. A copy of the data collection form can be found in **Appendix B**.

This report will focus on six sexual assault offense types defined by the Wisconsin UCR program. These offense types are: Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, Assault with an Object, Forcible Fondling, Statutory Rape, and Ejaculate/Excrete upon Victim. These offenses are defined in **Appendix A**.

This report is organized into four separate sections related to different elements of sexual assault incidents: offenses, victim, relationships, and offenders. Each section entails a further breakdown of related aspects and demographics which are accompanied by tables and charts outlining the statistical analysis of these findings. The offense section encompasses the volumes and trends of specific sexual assaults, clearance rates, location type, weapons, unfounded cases, and information on assault and report dates. The victim section includes specific demographic information and trends of juvenile and adult victim rates. The relationship section is comprised of victim-offender relationships and domestic versus non-domestic offense analyses, while the offender section includes general offender demographics and information on juvenile versus adult offenders. In addition, detailed data tables are provided in the **Appendices** for further statistical information.

## Overview

### Data

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The assaults described and analyzed in this report are those reported to law enforcement agencies for the period of January 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010. The data are submitted to the SAC as part of the monthly UCR report of law enforcement agencies.

The data used for this report were extracted from two separate UCR data systems. The first system, the Wisconsin Summary-Based Reporting system (SBR), collects data through the Wisconsin Sexual Assault Reporting Form, which is reproduced in **Appendix B**. The second, the Wisconsin Incident-Based Reporting system (IBR), collects data electronically through monthly incident reports submitted by law enforcement. Although two separate UCR data systems are used, both SBR and IBR are similar in the way sexual assault data are collected.

In this report an incident is defined as one assault against one victim. A series of assaults against one person which constitutes one “clear and distinct criminal operation” is counted as one offense. An example of an ongoing incident is where an assault situation is repeated over several months or years against the same victim.

As with any sensitive crime, actual reports of offenses to law enforcement agencies are not totally representative of all assaults committed. Assaults not reported to law enforcement agencies cannot be addressed in this report, even though they may be reported to other agencies such as social services or medical agencies.

The data contained in the report focus on all reported cases, regardless of the eventual disposition of the cases by the law enforcement agency or the court. The factual accuracy of these reported assaults and the circumstances surrounding them have, in a legal sense, not been substantiated.

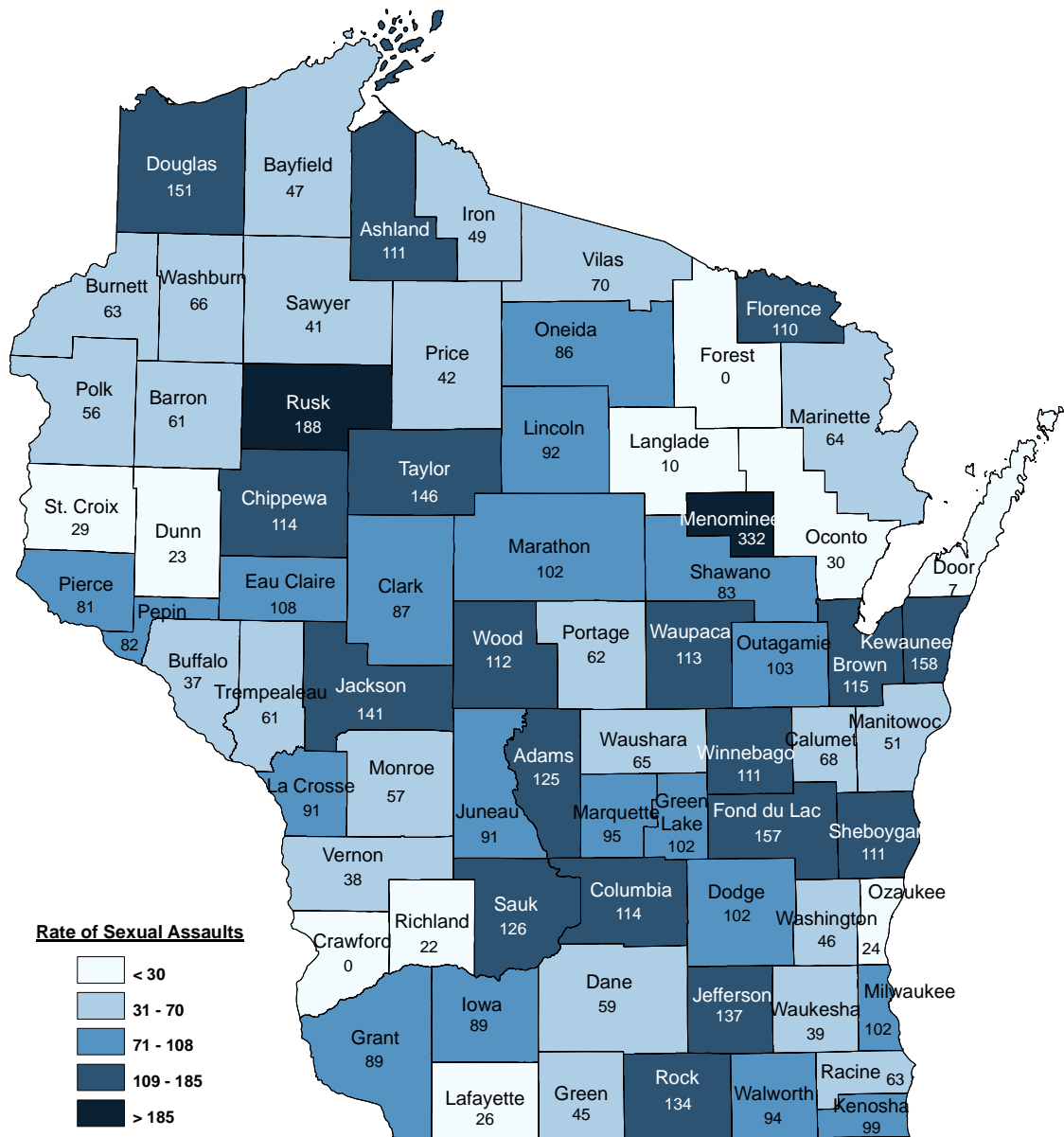
For purposes of this report, Sexual Assaults include the following offenses: Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex, Assault with an Object, Forcible Fondling, Statutory Rape, and Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim.

## Major Findings

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### Offenses

- There were 4,857 sexual assaults reported to law enforcement in 2010, up 5% from 4,627 in 2009.
- Forcible Fondling accounted for 45% of the reported Sexual Assaults, while Forcible Rape comprised of 24%.
- The overall clearance rate for sexual assaults reported in 2010 was 52%, down from 57% in 2009.
- Weapons were used in 1,115 incidents, less than 23% of Wisconsin's sexual assaults; most often used were Hands/Fist/Feet (80%).
- Over half of all sexual assaults were reported within one day of the incident.
- The Victim Residence and the Offender Residence categories combined, comprised of nearly two-thirds of the location sites in reported sexual assaults.

### Victims

- A five-year trend shows Juveniles had been the highest victimized population, with juveniles aged 15 and under represented nearly two-thirds of all victims in 2010.
- Females represented nearly 85% of sexual assault victims, and were most often victims of Forcible Fondling and Forcible Rape.
- The vast majority of sexual assault victims sustained no physical injury.
- Sexual assault victims and their offenders are most often of the same race.

### Relationships

- In over half of all reported sexual assaults, the offender was a non-family member who was known by the victim.
- Both Domestic and Non-Domestic sexual assault reports have held a steady rate since 2006, with most reported cases Non-Domestic in nature.
- The most common offense in Domestic cases was Forcible Fondling, usually by Other Family, followed by Statutory Rape most often by Boyfriend/Girlfriend.
- The relationship most often reported as involved in all sexual assaults was Acquaintance of the victim.

### Offenders

- There were 5,287 offenders reportedly involved in the 4,857 sexual assault cases in 2010.
- Over two-thirds of sexual assault offenders were between the ages of 11 and 30 years old.
- While Adults were consistently involved in most sexual assaults over the last five years, both Adults and Juvenile offender rates have remained steady since 2006.
- More than 90% of sexual assault offenders reported to law enforcement in Wisconsin were male.
- The most often cited sexual assault for both Juvenile and Adult offenders was Forcible Fondling.
- Juveniles offenders (aged 0-17 years old) were reported in sexual assaults at a comparable rate to Adults.

# Offenses

## Offenses

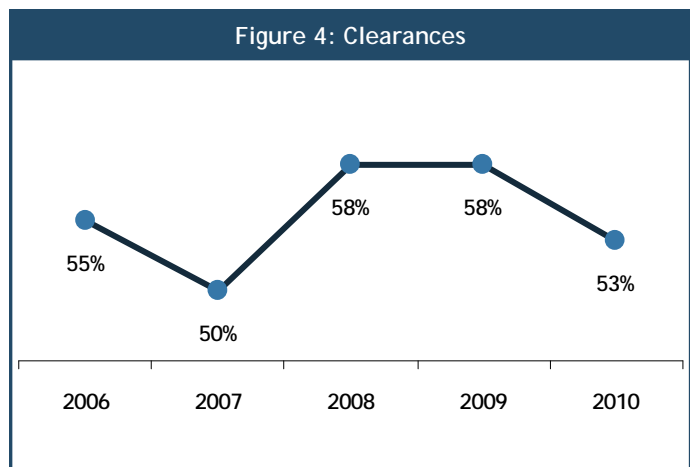
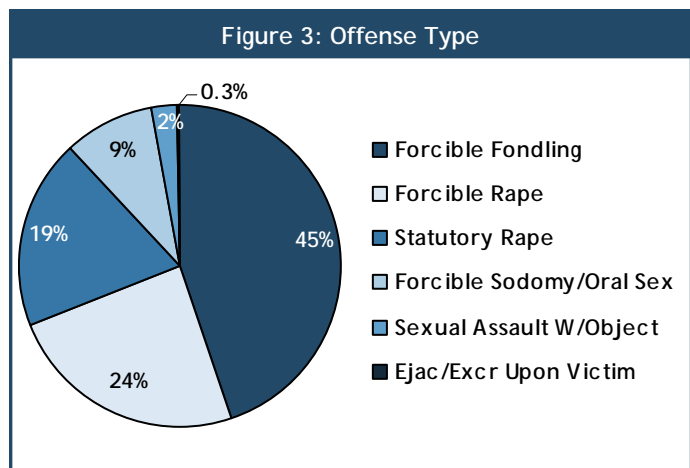
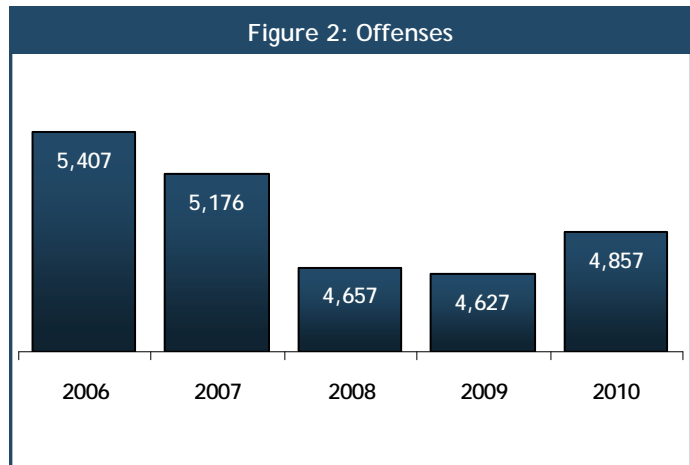
A five-year comparison reveals an increase in sexual assaults reported to law enforcement from 2009 to 2010, after a steady decline since 2006. There were increases in Forcible Rape, Forcible Fondling and Statutory Rape; decreases in Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex, and Sexual Assault with an Object; while Ejaculation /Excretion Upon Victim remained unchanged (*Appendix C: Table 1*).

## Offense Types

Figure 3 displays the breakdown of the 4,857 reported sexual assaults by offense in 2010. The most often reported incident type was Forcible Fondling, which made up nearly half (45%) of all the reported sexual assaults in Wisconsin in 2010. The second highest reported sexual assault offense was Forcible Rape, followed by Statutory Rape and Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex (24%, 19% and 9%, respectively). The least often reported offenses were Sexual Assault with an Object (2%) and Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim (0.3%).

## Clearances

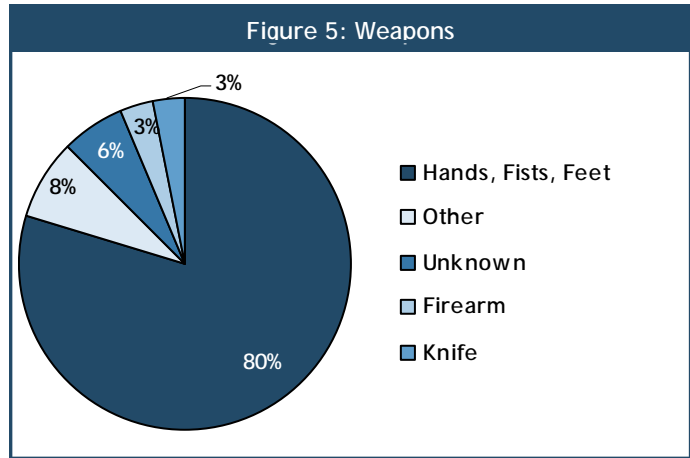
The rate of sexual assault clearances by arrest had followed a rise-and-fall pattern over the five-year period with the average clearance rate at 56%. The clearance rate for cases began in 2006 at 55%, dropped to the lowest point in 2007 (50%), but rose through 2008 and 2009 falling a bit to 53% in 2010. As displayed in *Appendix C: Table 2*, the 2010 Statutory Rape offense category had the highest clearance rate (60%), followed closely by Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex clearance rates (58%), while Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim had the lowest (43%). Notably, the clearance rate of Forcible Rapes dropped by 7% from the previous year.



# Offenses

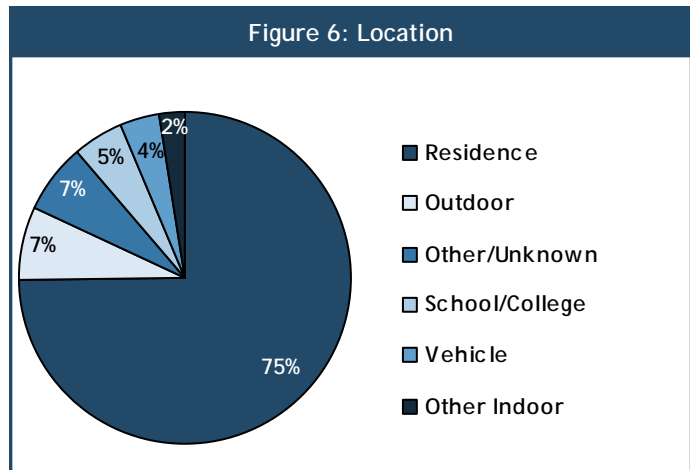
## Weapons

Weapons were used in 1,115 of the 4,857 reported sexual assaults in 2010. As shown in Figure 5, the weapons most often reported were personal weapons such as Hands/Fists/Feet (80%). The second largest weapon category, cited in 8% of the reports, was Other which included Drugs, Poison, Blunt Objects, and additional items. Six percent of cases were reported as having an Unknown weapon involved. Together, Firearms and Knives/Cutting Instruments represented approximately 6% of weapons used in these sexual assault cases.



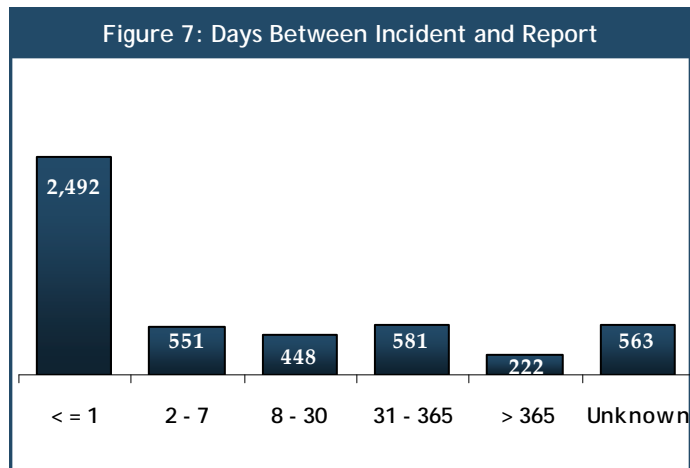
## Location

Figure 6 provides a breakdown of sexual assaults by location type. The Residence category accounts for the three-quarters of sexual assault locations. The Victim Residence and the Offender Residence were overwhelmingly the most often cited location types, representing nearly two-thirds of the reported locations (33% and 29%, respectively). Also included in the Residence category is Other residence which followed as the third most reported site of sexual assaults and accounted for 13% of location types. The Other Indoor category, which entails temporary lodgings and residential facilities, among others, was the least likely location to be the site of a sexual assault (*Appendix C: Table 4*).



## Time Between Incident and Report

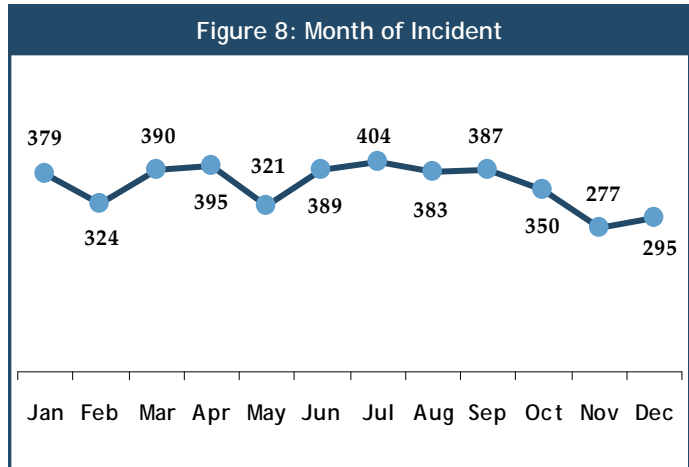
Figure 7 displays the period of time between the date a sexual assault occurred and when it was reported to law enforcement. As shown, the vast majority of sexual assaults were reported within one day of the incident. Of those reported within one day of the incident, 58% were cleared by arrest (*Appendix C: Table 5*).



# Offenses

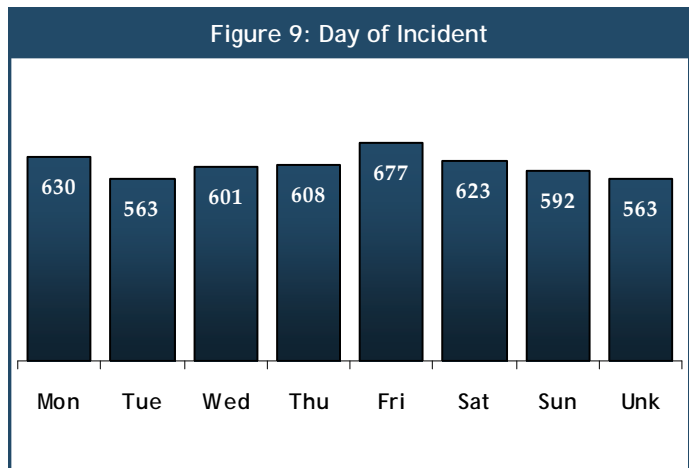
## Month of Incident

Figure 8 provides a breakdown of sexual assaults by the month in which the incidents occurred. Sexual assault trends stayed mostly consistent throughout the year with the fewest number being reported in November and December. There were 563 sexual assaults reported with an unknown month.



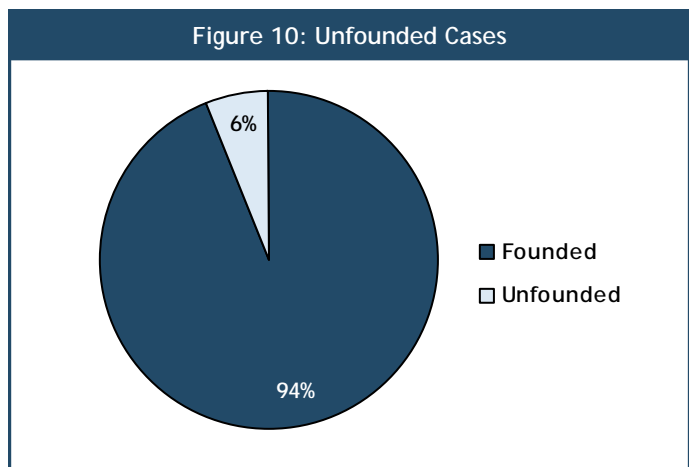
## Day of Incident

The chart in Figure 9 displays information pertaining to the frequency of sexual assaults by the day which the incident was committed. The known days which most sexual assaults occurred was Friday (14%) and Monday (13%). However, whereas in 2009 most sexual assaults were reported as having occurred on an Unknown day, this category and Tuesday are the least reported categories, both accounting for 12% of reported days, respectively.



## Unfounded Cases

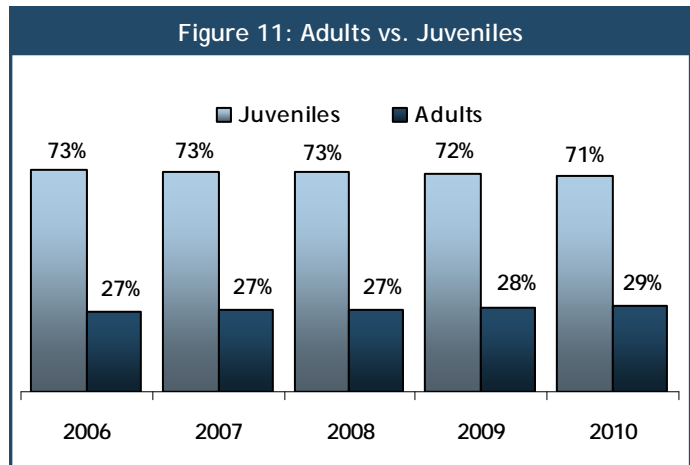
Occasionally, law enforcement will receive complaints that are determined through investigation to be false or baseless. In other words, no crime occurred and the case will be reported as Unfounded. A false report (or allegation) is a sexual assault that is factually proven to have never occurred or been attempted. A baseless report is a reported sexual assault that does not meet the elements of a crime. As presented in Figure 10, 6% of all sexual assaults reported in Wisconsin were classified to be Unfounded cases in 2010.



# Victims

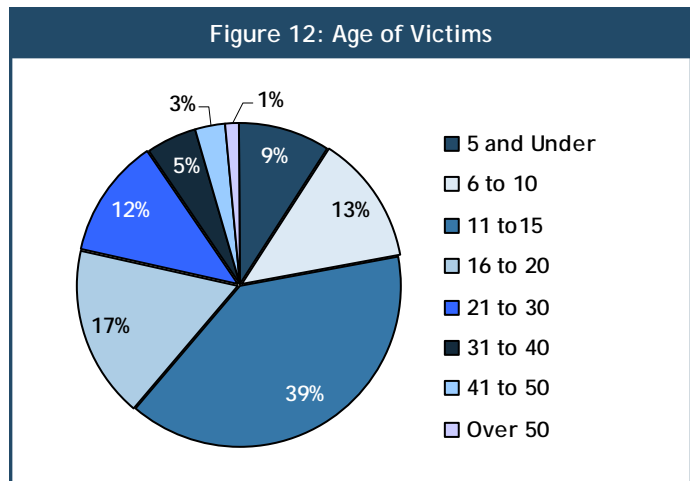
## Adults vs. Juveniles

Figure 11 provides a five-year trend of sexual assault victims of Juvenile and Adult. Between 2006 and 2010, juveniles consistently represented nearly three-quarters of this population. During this time period, the percentage of Juvenile victims continued to decrease slightly as the percentage of Adult victims increased slightly, but overall remained consistent.



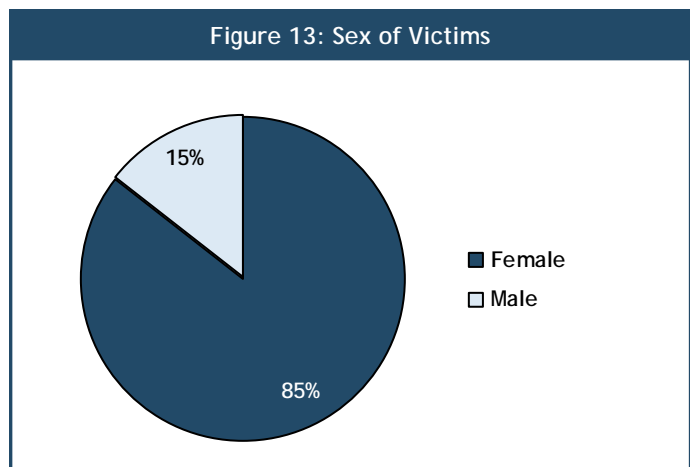
## Age of Victims

Victims under the age of 21 represented over 75% of sexual assault victims in 2010. Juveniles in the 11-15 year old category accounted for the largest percentage of sexual assault victims (39%). The next most prevalent victim age groups were 16-20, followed by 6-10 (17% and 13%, respectively). The least often victimized age groups were 41-50 and over 50, which, combined, account for 5% of victims. As found in *Appendix D: Table 6*, victims in the 16-20 age group were most often targets of Forcible Rape (307), while victims in the 11-15 year age group were most often involved in Statutory Rape incidents (818).



## Sex of Victims

Over 86% of all sexual assault victims in reported incidents in 2010 were identified as Female and were most often victims of Forcible Fondling and Forcible Rape (1,828 and 1,180; respectively). Forcible Fondling and Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex were the two highest offense types for Male victims (340 and 197, respectively). For more information on sexual assault offense types by the sex of the victim, see *Appendix D: Table 8*.



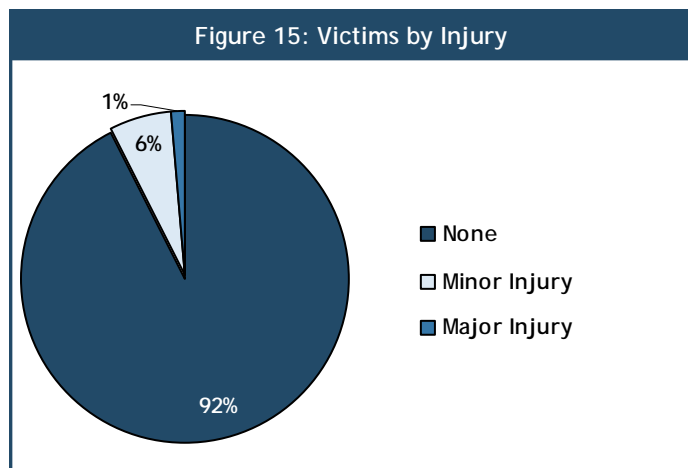
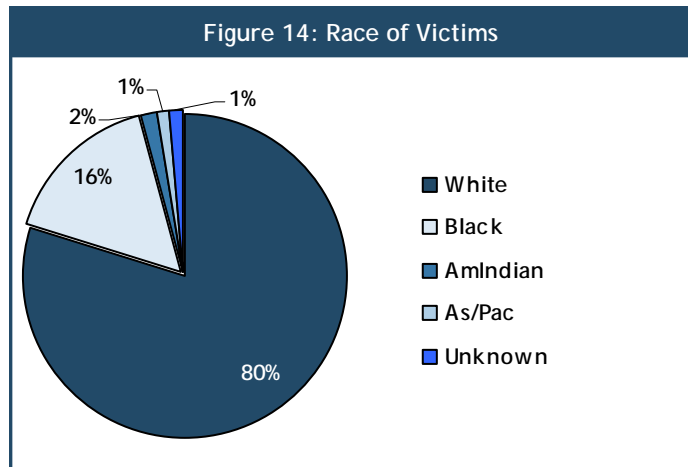
## Victims

### Race of Victims

Figure 14 reveals that 80% of victims were identified as White in the 2010 Wisconsin sexual assault reports. The next most victimized racial groups were Black and American Indian/Alaskan Native (16% and 2%, respectively). The racial group least often cited as victims of sexual assault was Asian/Pacific Islander (1%). One percent of all victims were racially identified as Unknown. As presented in *Appendix D: Table 9*, Forcible Fondling was overwhelmingly the most prevalent offense involving victims of White, Black and Unknown racial groups. When examining Asian/Pacific Islander and American Indian/Alaskan Native victim populations, the rate of Forcible Rape rivals that of Forcible Fondling (21 versus 16 and 30 versus 20 incidents, respectively).

### Victims by Injury

The vast majority of sexual assault reports made to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2010 identified that victims had not sustained any physical injury (92%). Of the 4,857 incidents, 298 victims reported Minor Injuries (6%). The remaining 70 incidents, or 1%, resulted in Major Injuries; including Apparent Broken Bones, Possible Internal Injuries, and Severe Laceration. The offense type that resulted in the most injuries was Forcible Rape (177), followed by Forcible Fondling and Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex (80 and 43, respectively). For a more detailed look at the victim injuries by offense type see *Appendix D: Table 7*.



## Relationships

### Victim-Offender Relationships

Nearly 90% of sexual assaults in 2010 were committed by someone known to the offender (not including instances where the relationship was Unknown). The most common victim-offender relationship was Known: Outside of Family; which includes victim Acquaintances, Friends, Neighbors, and Babysitters among other relations. This group accounted for 52% of the victim-offender relationships. Known: Family/Household Members/Dating Partners was the next highest offending relationship group, which accounted for 37%. Approximately 6% of reported sexual assault incidents involved a Stranger.

### Domestic vs. Non-Domestic

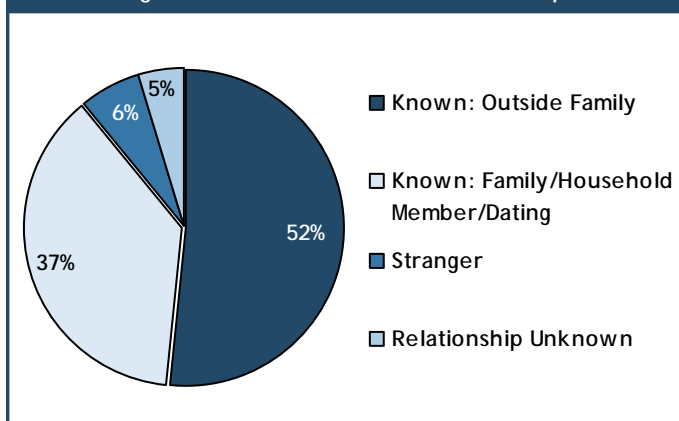


Figure 17: Domestic vs. Non-Domestic

Figure 17 shows a five-year trend in Domestic versus Non-Domestic incidents. The percentage of both Domestic and Non-Domestic incidents remained steady over the five year span. The majority of offenses during this time period were reported as Non-Domestic in nature. As shown in *Appendix E: Table 10*, Boyfriend/Girlfriend is the highest offending Domestic sub-category, involved most often in Statutory Rape case (401). In contrast, Acquaintances (included in the Non-Domestic relationship category) were involved in the most Forcible Rape and Forcible Fondling (381 and 566, respectively).

### Domestic Offenses in 2010

Of all reported Domestic sexual assaults in 2010, Forcible Fondling was the most reported offense, followed by Statutory Rape (42% and 24%, respectively). Forcible Rape accounted for 20% of Domestic sexual assaults.

Figure 16: Victim Offender Relationships

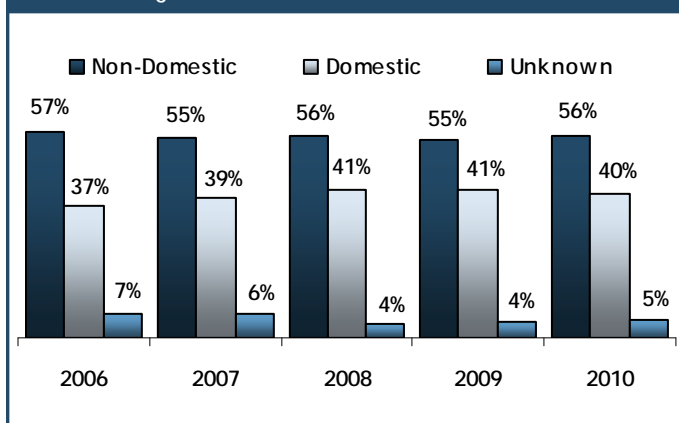
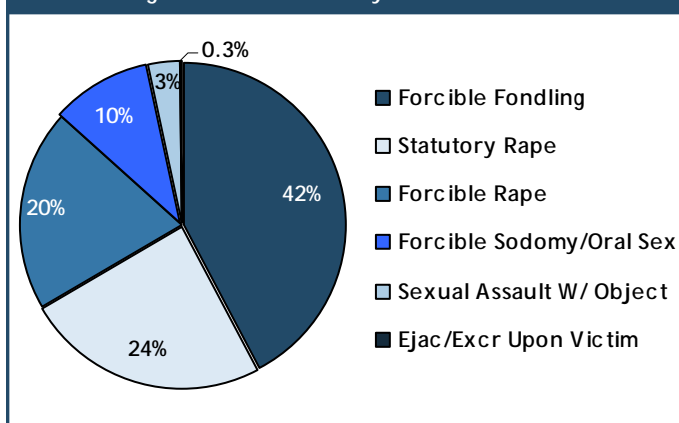


Figure 18: Domestic by Offense in 2010

### Offenders

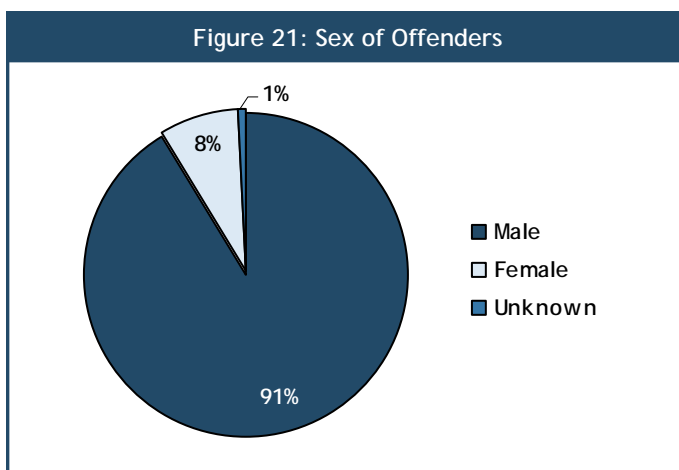
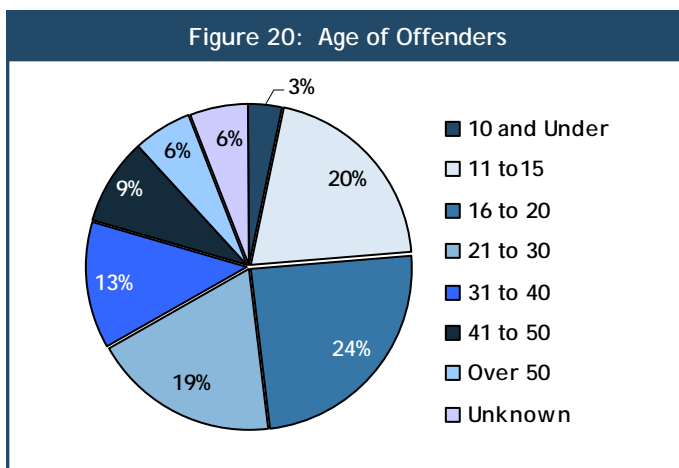
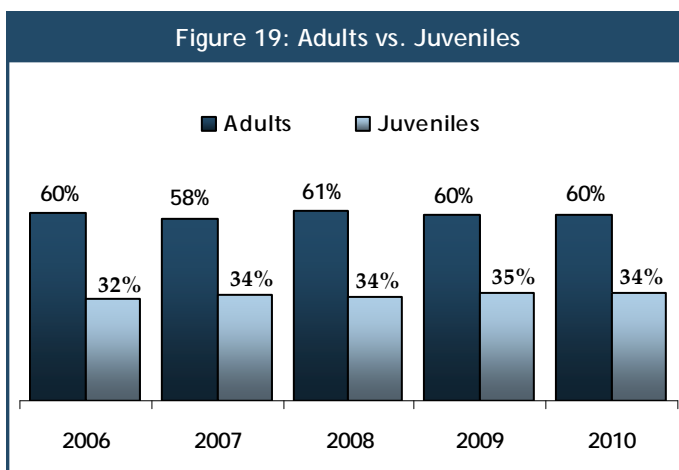
Figure 19 reveals that the population of Adult and Juvenile offenders has remained consistent over the past five years. The Juvenile offender population was highest in 2009 at 35%, climbing from its lowest point at 32% in 2006. The Adult offender population was 60% in 2006, then fluctuated slightly before ending back at 60% in both 2009 and 2010.

### Age of Offenders

Of the 4,857 reported sexual assault incidents there were 5,287 offenders, two-thirds were between the ages of 11 and 30 years old. The 16-20 year old age group was recorded as having the highest rate of sexual assaults, which represented 24% of reported offenders. Although the 10 and under age group made up 22% of victims, the group composed only 3% of offenders. And while juveniles age 11-15 years represented the largest victimized group (39%), they offended at a much lower rate (20%). As shown in *Appendix F: Table 13*, offenders aged 21-30 commit the highest rate of Forcible Rape (362), while Forcible Fondling is committed most often by the 11-15 year age group (520).

### Sex of Offenders

The chart in Figure 21 reveals that just over 90% of sexual assault offenders as reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2010 were identified as Males. Additional information in *Appendix F: Table 14* shows Statutory Rape and Forcible Fondling are the highest reported offenses involving female offenders (188 and 162, respectively). Male offenders are most often associated with Forcible Fondling and Forcible Rape cases (2,137 and 1,265, respectively).

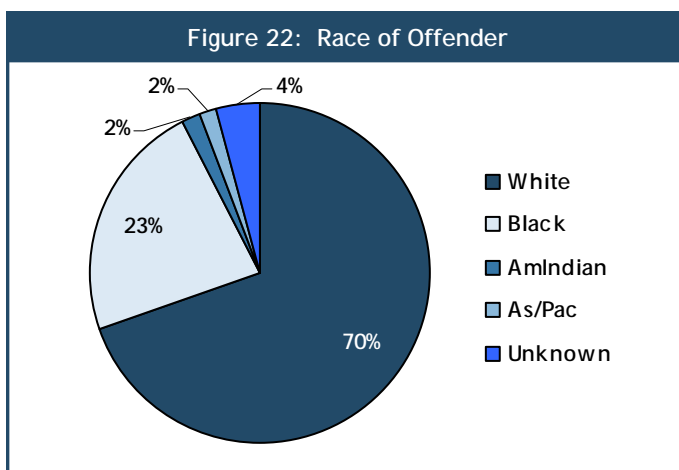




## Offenders

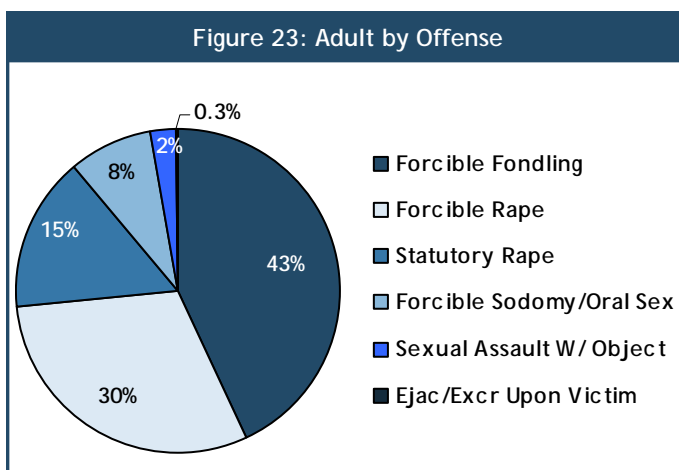
### Race of Offenders

As shown in Figure 22, nearly three-quarters of reported sexual assaults were committed by White offenders (70%). The second most cited racial group of offenders was Black, followed distantly by "Unknown" (22% and 4%, respectively). The racial categories least reported as committing sexual assaults were American Indians/Alaskan Natives and Asian/Pacific Islanders, which combined, represented roughly 4% of all offenders in 2010. Of the 5,287 offenders, 3,476 White offenders were involved with acts against White victims, while 715 Black offenders were involved in sexual assaults against Black victims (*Appendix F: Table 17*).



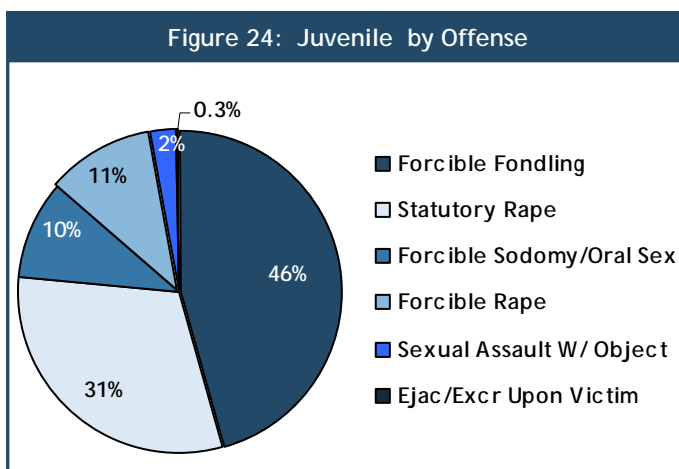
### Adults by Offense Type

The most common sexual assault involving known Adult offenders, classified as age 18 years old and over, was Forcible Fondling (43%). The second most common type of sexual assault related to this group was Forcible Rape (30%), followed by Statutory Rape (15%). The offense category with the least reports of Adult sex offenders was Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim (0.3%), followed by Sexual Assault with an Object (2%).



### Juveniles by Offense Type

Juveniles offenders (aged 0-17 years old) were reported in sexual assaults at a comparable rate to Adults, with the exception of Statutory Rape, which they were involved in over twice as often (31% versus 15%, respectively). Of known Juvenile offenders, 11% associated with Forcible Rape cases. The most often cited sexual assaults for Juveniles were Forcible Fondling (46%) and Statutory Rape .





# APPENDIX

## Appendix A: Definitions

### Sexual Assault Definitions

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Sexual assaults encompass a wide range of incidents, from violent rapes to less physically injurious sexual contact. While the nature of victim impact connected to an assault is related to a number of factors, such as the extent of the victim's trauma, physical injuries, and so forth, these are not always easily measured. The nature of victim impact connected to the assault is also defined, to some degree, by the six offense categories utilized in the Uniform Crime Reporting - Incident-Based Reporting system, as defined below:

- **Forcible Rape:** The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

*Note:* If force was used or threatened, the crime should be classified as Forcible Rape regardless of the age of the victim. If no force was used or threatened and the victim was under the statutory age of consent, the crime should be classified as Statutory Rape.

- **Forcible Sodomy:** Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
- **Sexual Assault with an Object:** The use of an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person forcibly and/or against that person's will, or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

*Note:* An "object" or "instrument" is anything used by the offender other than the offender's genitalia. Examples include a finger, bottle, handgun, stick, etc.

- **Forcible Fondling:** The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that person's will, or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

*Note:* Forcible Fondling includes "Indecent Liberties" and "Child Molesting." Although "force" April not have been used, offenses may fall into this category because the victim was incapable of giving consent, or did not give consent.

- **Statutory Rape:** Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent. In Wisconsin no unmarried juvenile can give consent to sexual intercourse. Only when the victim is under 16 years of age is intercourse defined as a sexual assault.

*Note:* Both parties would be offenders and victims in an assault if they are both under age 16.

- **Ejaculate/Excrete Upon Victim:** Intentional penile ejaculation or the emission of urine or feces by the offender upon any part of the body of the victim, for the purpose of sexually degrading or sexually humiliating the victim or for the purpose of sexually arousing or gratifying the offender.

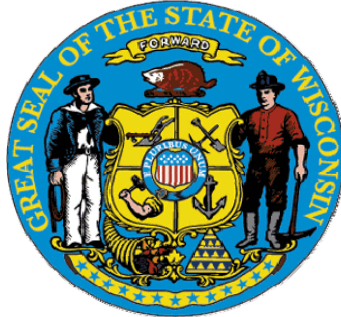
